Breeda/Steve,

Our response to the two questions is below:

The additional 64 acres were surveyed due to the following:

- 1) Relocation of the Visitors Center.
- 2) Road corridor expansion for the main access road to avoid Site MW002. [Note: This is no longer needed since no additional work is required for Site MW002.]
- 3) Relocation of a construction staging area.

The three areas comprising the 64 acres are shown on figures in the August 2009 Amendment to the Class III Cultural Resources Inventory attached at the end of the 9/9/09 RAI submittal package.

We have confirmed that the Rev. 1 estimates in the ER for disturbance, grading, and cut and fill account for the additional 64 acres that were surveyed.

Hi Jim,

Earlier, I left you a voicemail message on several items. One item is that Steve Lemont let me know that the environment reviewers need clarification concerning the additional 64 acres that were added to the EREF project area, subsequent to your submittal of ER Rev. 1. AREVA provided a supplementary archaeological survey for this area, which was included with the September 9, 2009 RAI response.

Argonne has questions about what prompted the addition of the 64 acres to the project area. Answers to the questions below would help to clarify the cultural and historic resources discussion and other information in the EIS associated with site preparation and construction activities.

If possible, we could discuss during Monday's weekly status call. Otherwise, we can schedule a separate call at your convenience. We do not need a written response.

The questions are:

1. What will the additional 64 acres be used for? Will any part of the 64 acres be used for temporary construction facilities, parking areas, material storage, or excavated areas for underground utilities? (132.5 acres were listed in the ER for these purposes.)
2. Will any part of the 64 acres require grading (in addition to the 407.5 acres requiring grading as discussed in the ER)? If yes, then how much will it change the cut and fill volumes given in the ER (i.e., the 27.5 million cubic feet of soil)?
