Dear Mr. Brooks:

This refers to your NRC license listed above. The original license issued April 25, 2002, does not include maximum possession limits for the radioisotopes authorized on the license. Current NRC policy requires that a license include a maximum possession limit for each radioisotope authorized on the license. Therefore, we have administratively amended your license to incorporate this requirement and Item 8 of the license is revised to include maximum possession limits for the radioisotopes authorized on the license. These limits are based on the information provided by Denise Richard of your staff on May 12, 2010 during our telephone conversation. Additionally, Condition(s) 13 and 19 that appear in the original license are removed as they are no longer needed. The remaining conditions have been renumbered in accordance with current NRC policy. Enclosed with this letter is the amended license.

You must request and receive an amendment to your license prior to acquiring licensed material in excess of the limits specified in Item 8 of the license.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand and fully implement all the conditions incorporated into the amended license. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region I Office, Licensing Assistance Team, (610) 337-5239, so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required, since this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR 51.22(c)(14).
