- 5) New Jersey Agreement State Commission Paper (Dennis Sollenberger and Torre Taylor): Governor Corzine signed the final application on October 16, 2008 and the final package was received by NRC on October 21, 2008. The staff hasis reviewing the package and prepar~~has begun preparation of~~ the staff assessment, Federal Register notice and Commission paper for publication of the draft Agreement. The Commission paper is in office concurrence and should be sent to the EDO in mid April. The State requested that the Agreement be effective no later than September 30, 2009. To meet the September 30, 2009 date, the staff needs prompt consideration of the paper and decision by the Commission. New Jersey would like to have the Agreement earlier, if possible. The NARM waiver expires for New Jersey on August 7, 2009 and an effective date closer to the waiver expiration date would be preferred. (Note: 510 NRC licensees based in NJ).
