Thanks. I don't believe I ever got a response from you about whether this language would be OK for 11.4, Onsite Disposal

(a) No owner or licensee shall dispose of radioactive material onsite by burial in the soil OR BY COVERING THROUGH THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN ENGINEERED BARRIER (CAPPING) without prior approval in writing from the Department.

(b) Sites that have been used for burial of radioactive materials OR WHERE RADIOACTIVE MATERIAL HAS BEEN CAPPED, shall not be converted to other uses except with the written permission of the Department.

(c) The owner of any burial ground OR CAPPED MATERIAL shall notify the Department in writing not less than 30 days in advance of any transfer of title to the property involved.
