Dear Mr. Torres:

This letter is in response to the 4-questions that you requested. We had received the letter from your office on May 21, 2010 along with the new license.

1. The Jicarilla Apache Nation, Contract Roads had never applied for a license with the State of New Mexico.
2. March 23, 2006, Mr. Byron G. Quintana, Radiation Safety Officer questioned John Parker and Walter Medina of the State of New Mexico Environmental Department, Radiation Control Bureau in Santa Fe, New Mexico, if Jicarilla Apache Nation, Contract Roads needed a license? They had told Mr. Quintana that the state had no jurisdiction on the Jicarilla Apache Reservation since it was on federal land and could not issue a license.
3. Jicarilla Apache Nation, Contract Roads had sent in Seaman 200 portable gauge, Serial # 426 to manufacture for repair and calibration on October 2009, this is when Mr. Quintana was informed of changes made and license requirement by NRC.
4. Jicarilla Apache Nation, Contract Roads first contacted the NRC on March 2006. On March 30, 2006, someone called Mr. Byron G. Quintana, RSO and said the NRC was not issuing license. Mr. Quintana was referred to the State of NM, Radiation Control Bureau.
