Dear Ms. Vietti-Cook,

I understand that PG&E has requested a 20-year license renewal of the nuclear reactors at its Diablo Canyon nuclear power plant.

I urge you to reject this license unless and until the recommendations of the Calif. Energy Commission (CEC) are met for advanced 3-D seismic and reflection mapping and analysis of a newly-discovered earthquake fault nearby.

This plant was poorly designed from the start. It's literally on shaky ground and Calif. rate-payers have already forked over \$4 billion to correct the original design flaws.

Why are we being asked now to invest nearly \$100 million more (the full cost of the extensive re-licensing process) for a plant that is sitting on an earthquake fault, with potentially disastrous consequences?
