Enclosed is Amendment No. 08 to your NRC Material License No. 13-15133-05 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

Please note that, as I discussed with you on May 24, 2010, via telephone, I authorized a slightly greater total activity in Subitem No. 8.A. than you requested in your facsimile letter dated May 21, 2010. I was able to do this because the Sealed Source and Device Registry Certificate (SSDR) for the gauging device in question permits a total possession of up to 15% more activity than the nominal amount listed. The amount authorized at the +15% level is slightly greater than the activity you requested.

I restructured the authorization in Subitem Nos. 8.A. and 9.A. to reflect, as closely as possible, the source activities and possession you requested, as matched with the SSDR certificate for this gauge.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions
