SUBJECT: VICTORIA COUNTY EARLY SITE PERMIT APPLICATION

Dear Mr. Sachtleben:

On June 8, 2010, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) accepted the Victoria County, Early Site Permit for docketing application. Under the NRC-U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), the docketing date begins the 10 working day period for the NRC to provide the docketed application to DHS.

The NRC-DHS MOU identified 90 days as the period for consultation. During our working level meetings, the staff clarified the consultation period to be 90 working days after the conclusion of a 10 working day period after the application is docketed. Because this is an Early Site Permit Application, DHS will determine if a consultation is necessary. If applicable, this letter will serve as the 10 day notification.
