The additional information requested is as follows:

1.a: Describe the control over the radiation safety program that will be delegated so that the consultant-RSO will be able to exercise authority over authorized users when confronted with radiation safety problems that require implementation of corrective actions.

Mr. Miguel A. Rios will be responsible for ensuring the safe use of radiation. He is responsible for managing the Radiation Protection Program; identifying radiation protection problems; initiating, recommending, or providing corrective actions; verifying implementation of corrective actions; stopping unsafe activities; and ensuring compliance with regulations. He will have the authority necessary to meet those responsibilities, including prohibiting the use of byproduct material by employees who do not meet the necessary requirements and shutting down operations were justified to maintain radiation safety: He is required to notify management if staff does not cooperate and does not address radiation safety issues. In addition, he is free to raise issues with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission at any time.

1.b: Describe the relationship that will exist between the consultant-RSO and your institutional management regarding expenditures of funds to facilitate the objectives of your radiation safety program and related regulatory requirements.

Operational funds needed for the radiation safety program and related regulatory requirements will be requested by Mr. Miguel A. Rios to the management and will be handle with the highest priority.

1.c: Identify other commitments of the consultant-RSO for other NRC or Agreement State licensed facilities, along with a description of how the consultant-RSO will allocate time to permit the performance of the duties of the RSO as described in the regulations. State the consultant-RSO's minimum amount of on-site time (hours per week).

Mr. Miguel A. Rios is the RSO of the VA Caribbean Healthcare System (License No. 30-23853-01VA, VHA Permit No. 52-04359-01); Carolina Nuclear and Cardiology Institute(License No. 52-25390-01);and "Brachytherapy" RSO at Ryder Memorial Hospital(License No. 52-21026-01).

Mr. Rios will spend a minimum on-site time of one (1) hour per week.

1.d: Appoint an in-house representative who will serve as the point of contact during the RSO's absence. This person may be allowed to assist the consultant RSO with limited authority.

Ms. Awilda Toasdo,Administrator will serve as the point of contact during the RSO's absence.


1.e: Describe the overall availability of the consultant-RSO to respond to questions or operational issues that arise during the conduct of your radiation safety program and related regulatory requirements. Specify the maximum amount of time it will take the RSO to arrive at the facility in the event of an emergency that requires his presence.
