Dennis and Torre -In your draft press release, I'm confused by this paragraph:

> If the proposed agreement is approved, it is estimated that there will be 700 total licenses in the State of New Jersey. NRC would transfer 500 licenses to the State's jurisdiction. In addition, the State would retain regulatory authority for approximately 500 NARM licenses. Approximately 300 of these NARM licenses are dually regulated by New Jersey and the NRC.

Will be 700? How many are there now? And of the 300 dually regulated NARM licenses, are they all included in the 500 licenses we will transfer to NJ, or will they continue to be dually regulated? Do we need to get into the NARM issue at all, or could we just leave it with the 500 to be transferred?
