FINAL SUMMARY OF INFORMATION COLLECTION REQUEST

Title: 10 CFR Part 95. Facility Security Clearance and Safeguarding of National Security Information and Restricted Data, 3150-0047

Current Burden/Responses: 954 hours/ 308 responses (298 responses + 10 recordkeepers)

Proposed Burden/Responses: 1,087 hours / 338 responses (328 responses + 10 recordkeepers)

Frequency of Response: On occasion

Number of Respondents: 16

Reasons for Changes in Burden/Responses:

The overall burden increased by 133 hours from 954 to 1,087 hours. The reporting burden increased by 133 hours from 805 to 938 hours and the recordkeeping burden remained at 149 hours. This estimate is based on NRC staff experience and a re-estimation of annual reporting hours. As licensees increasingly rely on networks rather than hard copy documentation, the NRC has been receiving more changes to their security practices and procedures and network security plans submitted for approval. This includes:

- Increase of 8 responses and 32 hours for licensees making changes to their Standard Practice Procedures Plan under 95.19(a)&(b).
- Increase of 19 responses and 95 hours for licensees to submit Classified Network Security Plans under 95.39(d)

In addition, the NRC made a minor correction to the estimate for licensees making classification changes under 95.45(a)&(d). This resulted in an increase of 3 responses and 6 hours.

The hourly rates increased from \$215/hr. to \$257/hr. for professional effort in accordance with Part 170. The estimated cost per burden hour is based upon NRC's annual fee recovery rule. This cost is fully recoverable by fee assessments to NRC licensees pursuant to 10 CFR Part 171.

Recordkeeping Requirements in Accordance with the Retention Periods for Records/Rule:

10 CFR 95.34(b) and 10 CFR 95.36(d) require that licensees, certificate holders, or others shall retain records of foreign visits for 5 years beyond the date of the visit. This requirement is needed to check the history of foreign visitors in case they become targets of interest by the United States Government.

Abstract: NRC-regulated facilities and other organizations are required to provide information and maintain records to ensure that an adequate level of protection is provided to NRC-classified information and material.
