INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

ACCEPTANCE: This is to advise you that those individuals in Enclosure 1 have been accepted for participation in the training course H-401, "Nuclear Pharmacy Course." COURSE: The course will begin at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, August 17, 2010, and end at 4:00 p.m. each day except for Thursday, August 19, 2010. The August 19 course will end at 12:00 noon. Participants must make their own lodging and travel arrangements. Cellular phones and similar devices with audible capability should be disabled while classes are in session. Normal office/business attire is appropriate for students attending Technical Training Center courses.
