



On Friday, the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board (ASLB or the Board) issued the attached scheduling order in the proceeding on the DOE license application for a high-level waste repository at Yucca Mountain, laying out how the Board intends to proceed on the new petitions to intervene (WA, SC, and Aiken County, SC) and the DOE motion to withdraw the application. As you will see in the attached, the Board has decided to address the petitions to intervene first, setting a filing schedule for parties in the proceeding to respond to these petitions. Here are some of the deadlines of interest:

- parties' responses to the petitions to intervene from WA, SC, and Aiken County, SC must be filed by March 29, 2010
- the petitioners' replies to the parties' responses will be due April 5, 2010
- given that the petitions to intervene will be addressed first, the Board has waived the 10-day deadline for parties to respond to DOE's motion to withdraw the application; a new response date will be set by the Board once it has been determined whether SC, WA, and Aiken County shall be permitted to intervene.
