I am concerned about the state of the Broad River if another containment pond is built using water that would ordinarily go into the Broad River directly. We need further information about how this water use will affect communities downstream. What happens as population, agriculture, ^{needs} grows? Will these containment ponds continue to be licensed? No matter where water is contained or for what it is used, it is still a part of a healthy & ecologically safe watershed. A couple years ago reactors on the ~~Catch~~ ^{Chick} Tr. River - a huge river in Tennessee - had to be shut down because of drought problems.

I want to be assured that the Army Corps of Engineers and the NRC can be trusted with this project. In recent years they have failed us, along with corporations they regulate.

Conservation of Energy is the best solution to our energy needs. Energy use has decreased in recent years & we see as conservation takes hold, no new plants will be needed. I cannot support this project because of these reasons.
