SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENTAL SCOPING
MEETING CONDUCTED RELATED TO THE COMBINED LICENSE
APPLICATION REVIEW OF THE WILLIAM STATES LEE III NUCLEAR
STATION, UNITS 1 AND 2

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) staff conducted a supplemental environmental scoping meeting related to the Supplement to the Environmental Report regarding Make-Up Pond C, for the William States Lee III Nuclear Station, Units 1 and 2 (Lee), combined license (COL) application submitted by Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (Duke). The public meetings were conducted on Thursday, June 17, 2010, at Restoration Church International, 1905 N. Limestone Street, Gaffney SC. The meeting began with a formal presentation given by NRC and USACE staff. After the presentation there was a short question and answer period, followed by a public comment period. Approximately 100 people attended the meeting, and approximately 30 people provided comments. Participants included: members of the NRC and USACE staff; one NRC contractor from Pacific Northwest National Laboratory; members of the public; representatives from Duke; State and local government officials; the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control; and regional environmental groups. Public comments and questions were mainly focused on water availability in the Broad River, renewable energy alternatives, high level waste, and economic considerations of building new nuclear reactors.

The purpose of the meeting was to provide the public with an opportunity to participate in a supplemental environmental scoping process by providing comments on the addition of a third cooling water reservoir, called "Make-Up Pond C," to the Lee Nuclear Station project. During the meeting the NRC staff presentation briefly outlined the NRC's National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 review process; introduced USACE as a cooperating agency in the environmental review; described the proposed addition of Make-Up Pond C; and described how comments could be submitted regarding the environmental impacts of Make-Up Pond C.
