Dear Mr. Mullauer,

We need to make an amendment to our current radioactive license # 13-32528-01. It has been brought to our attention we have an error on the last version of the license that was sent to us. Our license used to say "no single source to exceed the amount specified in the device registration" and was changed to say "one source not to exceed 5000 millicuries". We understand this was done for security purposes and to maintain an accurate database over what everyone has, however, the gauge that we have actually contains two sealed sources. We would like to request a change to the wording that would state "two sources not to exceed 5000 millicuries each".

In addition to this request, Greg Hewitt has left our organization. We would like to change the Radiation Safety Officer to Susan Engelhardt of Engelhardt and Associates who has served in this capacity for us before. We are currently in the process of bringing in a new employee that will assume the role of Radiation Safety Officer after completing the appropriate training in October of 2010. They are scheduled to attend the training conducted by Engelhardt and Associates in St. Louis on October 11 - October 13 as well as initial training on July 9th 2010, at our location, which will be conducted by Susan Engelhardt. Upon completion of that training we will file for a license amendment to designate our new employee as radiation safety officer.

Plymouth Tube Company authorizes the Radiation Safety Officer to act on behalf of the company in cases of radiological emergencies. We acknowledge by naming Susan Engelhardt as the radiation safety officer we will be relinquishing that authority to her as referenced in NUREG 1556 Appendix I Volume 9. We will maintain a signed copy of this appendix on file while Susan Engelhardt is performing the role of radiation safety officer.

While Susan Engelhardt is acting as our RSO we will provide all radiation workers with the phone number that Susan can be reached at. We will discuss all IMS issue's with her and act on her advice to correct the issue. In the event we do not have adequate resources available to handle an abnormal situation Susan Engelhardt can be at our facility within six hours.

We understand the importance of maintaining accurate records and therefore request these changes be expedited.
