Dear Mr. Senter:

Enclosed is your NRC Material License No. 24-32795-01 in accordance with your request.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

**In the course of our review of your application dated April 5, 2010, we noticed that the sealed source model number listed for your portable measuring device did not match the sealed source model number designation in the NRC's Sealed Source and Device Registry (SSDR).**

**During a telephone conversation on July 8, 2010, between you and me and my associate, Colleen Casey, you mentioned that the "7" recorded on the application for the source model number designation was extraneous. The sealed source model number designation listed on your license now matches the one listed in the SSDR for the device listed on your NRC material license.**

**We noted that the application dated April 5, 2010, that was signed by you was signed with a very abbreviated "signature/initials." In order to ensure the security of our licensees and protect the licenses we administer, please sign your complete first and last name more legibly for all future correspondence.**

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosure will be available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html>

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.
