Dear Mr. Hermann:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 10 to your NRC Material License No. 21-20020-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold font**.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

In your correspondence to us dated March 16, 2010, and June 30, 2010, you indicated that you wished to release for unrestricted use a former address of use and area of use, located at 713 South Scott Street, South Bend, Indiana and 4703 Chester Drive, Elkhart, Indiana, respectively.

The NRC staff has reviewed your final status surveys, which consisted of leak test results taken from your gauging devices. Based on its review, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from your former address of use and area of use, located at 713 South Scott Street, South Bend, Indiana and 4703 Chester Drive, Elkhart, Indiana, respectively, and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria.

Based on these conclusions no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required for this address of use and area of use and they are suitable for unrestricted use.

Please note that we changed Condition Nos. 13. and 19 in your license and added Condition No. 13. F. These changes should enhance your awareness of regulatory requirements and the radiation safety program elements in your license.

In our review of your request, we noted an issue that we must resolve in order to consider your amendment "complete." Within 30 days of the date of this letter, please submit a written response to the following, addressed to my attention (Michael G. Herr, CHP), and reference it as "additional information to control number 318978." If you require additional time to prepare your response, please contact me to make alternative arrangements. We will then continue our review.

In your letters dated March 16, 2010, and June 30, 2010, we noted that several different versions of your corporate name appear: “Wightman Environmental,” “Wightman Ward, Inc.,” “Wightman & Associates, Inc.,” “Wightman Environmental, Inc.,” “Wightman Petrie,” and “Wightman Petrie, Inc.,” which appears on the facility diagrams.

Please respond by clarifying each of these corporate names and advise us as to whether all or only some of them pertain to this license. Has your company, the licensed entity, experienced a change in ownership or control? Has the corporate name that should appear on this license be changed in any way?

If the Wightman company which holds this license has had a change of ownership or control, please be advised that NRC must consent to this change of ownership or control, in writing, before the change takes effect. If this has already happened, please contact us immediately for further advice on how to proceed with licensing of the change in ownership or control. In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC’s “Rules of Practice,” a copy of this letter and its enclosure will be available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the NRC’s Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html>.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.
