
- **SRR is building upon the safety tradition by retaining safety and security as company priorities and prerequisites for any activity, and by performing with uncompromising integrity**
- **SRR is performing well in safety**





Scope of Work

- **WSRC was Liquid Waste (LW) contractor for SRS through June 30, 2009**
- **SRR took over as LW contractor July 1, 2009**
- **SRR workforce = 2,000 employees**
- **SRR contract is for the next 6 years, with a 2-year extension option**
- **SRS Liquid Waste Operations includes:**
 - **49 remaining waste tanks (2 tank farms)**
 - **5 major facilities**
 - **36 million gallons of waste**
 - **Highest risk material in South Carolina**
- **LW contract requires safely operating the integrated system of facilities to disposition high-activity radioactive liquid waste and low-activity liquid waste.**





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
