Sec. 552, I request access to and copies of any and all reports and/or test results from January 1, 1957 to August 10, 2010 concerning radioactive materials at 1001 College St., Madison, Illinois 62060 [site commonly known as Cherokee Industries, Spectrulite Consortium, Consolidated Aluminum Company (CONALCO), Phelps Dodge Aluminum Corp., and /or Dow Chemical].

I agree to pay reasonable duplication fees for the processing of this request in an amount not to exceed \$100.00. However, please notify me prior to your incurring any expenses in excess of that amount. If necessary, we will accept the documents in electronic format, preferably on CD-ROM.

If my request is denied in whole or part, I ask that you justify all deletions by reference to specific exemptions of the act. I will also expect you to release all segregable portions of otherwise exempt material. I, of course, reserve the right to appeal your decision to withhold any information or to deny a waiver of fees.



I certify that these statements regarding expedited processing are true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief.
