Enclosed is Amendment No. 25 to your NRC Material License No. 21-26532-01 in accordance with your request. Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions.

If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

This also refers to the telephone discussion between you and me on August 9, 2010, concerning clarification of your intentions regarding the Auburn Hills, Michigan facility on your license. In a letter dated May 3, 2010, you submitted a closeout survey for your former nuclear medicine department at the Auburn Hills, Michigan for unrestricted use. However, it was not clear from this letter whether you wanted to retain the Auburn Hills, Michigan address as a location of use. In our telephone discussion you stated that it was your intention to only release your former nuclear medicine department at the Auburn Hills, Michigan location as you are already authorized and occupying a new nuclear medicine department at the same address.

In the August 9, 2010, conversation, you also made it clear that the sealed sources mention in your May 3, 2010, letter had simply been moved from the old department to the new one. If my understanding in any of the above is incorrect, please contact me immediately at (630) 829-9841.

The NRC staff has reviewed your final status surveys. Based on its review, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from your former nuclear medicine department at the Auburn Hills, Michigan facility and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria. Based on these conclusions no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required for your former nuclear medicine department at the Auburn Hills, Michigan facility and it is suitable for unrestricted use.

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS, the NRC's electronic document system.

Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31 and in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390, the enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability.

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The enclosed document contains sensitive security-related information.
When separated from this cover letter this letter is uncontrolled.

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

This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
