Enclosed is Amendment No. 41 to your NRC Material License No. 24-15513-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

In your correspondence to us dated February 12, 2010, and May 12, 2010, you indicated that you wished to release for unrestricted use the Clinical Pharmacology Research Lab located at 2401 Gillham Road, Kansas City, Missouri.

The NRC staff has reviewed your final status surveys, which consisted exposure rate and contamination surveys of the lab area. Based on its review, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from the Clinical Pharmacology Research Lab located at 2401 Gillham Road, Kansas City, Missouri, and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria.

Based on these conclusions no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required for the Clinical Pharmacology Research Lab and it is suitable for unrestricted use.
