Although the Black Hills area is sparsely populated, millions of people visit each year. Degradation of the local environment will jeopardize the state's tourism and ranching industries--those industries that have long sustained South Dakota's economy, and that will be left to deal with the mess long after PowerTech has gone back to Canada. This is an ongoing problem. Western South Dakota, including the Dewey-Burdock area, still has CERCLA sites from the last ventures of Canadian-posing-as-American companies' uranium and gold mining. The required bonds are NOT ADEQUATE to ensure restoration of the natural environment and water resources.

Canadian companies like Powertech are gaming the system. South Dakota and the federal government need to stop letting them create toxic messes, after which they invariably declare bankruptcy and leave. Western South Dakota is dotted with unreclaimed--and in some cases unreclaimable--former uranium mining sites. Please do not consider new permits until that problem has been solved.

Just say no to this latest plan to hit and run the precious resources of the Black Hills.
