Enclosed is Amendment No. 57 to your NRC Material License No. 13-16457-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers. If you have any questions concerning this amendment please contact me at either (630) 829-9841 or (800) 522-3025.

In correspondence dated February 22, 2010, March 22, 2010, and May 28, 2010, you indicated that you wished to release certain specified areas of use, such as therapy patient rooms and the former brachytherapy source storage room in your old hospital for unrestricted use.

The NRC staff has reviewed your final status surveys. Based on its review, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from the areas specified above, and in your correspondence, and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria. Based on these conclusions no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required for these areas of use and they are suitable for unrestricted use.

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS, the NRC's electronic document system.

Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31 and in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390, the enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability.

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
