## ORDER (Rescheduling Oral Argument)

After receipt of the final briefing document on the issue, the Board set oral argument for September 21, 2010 on the Intervenors¹ motion for admission of three new contentions. See Licensing Board Order (Scheduling Oral Argument) (Sept. 3, 2010) at 1 (unpublished). On September 8, 2010, the Applicant moved to reschedule the argument because its lead counsel will be unavailable on September 21 due to a previously-scheduled international commitment.

See Shaw Areva Mox Services' Motion to Reschedule Oral Argument and to Close Argument Based on SUNSI at 1 (Sept. 8, 2010) [hereinafter Shaw AREVA Motion].

Thereafter, the Board notified the parties informally that the oral argument would be rescheduled, and then worked with them to settle on an oral argument date as early as practicable given scheduling conflicts of the parties and the Judges. Accordingly, oral argument is hereby RESCHEDULED for Tuesday, October 12, 2010 at 2:30 pm EDT, to be held in the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board Panel's Rockville Hearing Room. The Board expects that the argument will last no longer than 90 minutes.

In the same document, the Applicant also moved to close the proceeding to the public, asserting that the Applicant, in arguing its position, would need to refer to, or otherwise to discuss, sensitive unclassified non-safeguards information (SUNSI). See Shaw AREVA Motion

at 2. The Board is aware that the Intervenors have requested that the NRC publicly disclose

certain SUNSI designated information contained in the pleadings. See Intervenors' Letter

Transmitting Motion for Admission of Contentions 9, 10, and 11 (July 26, 2010). To date, the

substance of that issue has not yet been resolved, but as a procedural matter the NRC Staff

and the Intervenors do not object to closing the proceeding in this instance, pending resolution

of the issue of which information is appropriately protected as SUNSI. See Shaw AREVA

Motion at 2.

Accordingly, in the interest of efficiency, but without signifying any Board conclusion as

to the NRC Staff's SUNSI designation of the prior pleadings, we will close the hearing to avoid

any potential disclosure problems. In the interim, we expect that the Intervenors, the Applicant,

and the NRC Staff will, as promised, work together to develop a process by which

inappropriately designated SUNSI information will be released to the public. See Shaw AREVA

Motion at 3. In that regard, at the conclusion of oral argument, the Board will hold a brief

conference with the parties to discuss their proposed resolution of the overall SUNSI

classification issues.

It is so ORDERED.
