**Travel to the Regions is to repair/replace failed equipment, if the problem cannot be resolved telephonically, and to relocate the Region IV DVS-G System. *Travel will be reimbursed IAW Federal Travel Regulations (FTR)*

1.0 BACKGROUND

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) has nine Defense Information Systems Network (DISN) Video System Global (DVS-G) Secure Video Teleconferencing (SVTC) systems. One is located at Headquarters (HQ) and two at each region. The NRC Region IV office is in the process of relocating to a new building, which is expected to take place in 1st or 2nd Quarter FY-11. In order to ensure minimum interruption of DVS-G service it is required that a company experienced in SVTC be used to remove, relocate, and reinstall this system. This contract task will ensure the least interruption of service of this critical capability.

2.0 CONTRACT OBJECTIVES

The objective of this contract is to purchase services for the relocation of the two Region IV DVS-G SVTC systems. Travel to Region IV will be required to perform the project.

3.0 SCOPE OF WORK

The contractor shall provide the personnel and materials required for the relocation of two DVS-G SVTC Systems. This relocation effort includes:

1. Removal of two DVS-G systems and ancillary devices from the current location, including but not limited to cabling, wiring, control systems, cameras, equipment cabinets, and video monitors.
2. Packing, as necessary, of all above items and moving them to the new location.
3. Reinstallation of both systems, including remounting of video monitors as directed by site personnel. This will include any necessary reprogramming of system devices to ensure proper operation.
4. System Operational Verification and Testing (SOVT) for both systems to demonstrate proper operation to the Project Manager and Site Representatives.

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5. Documentation of any system changes resulting from the move.

All work on this contract should be completed by January 31, 2011, but may run as long as June 30, 2011, pending the exercise of Option Period 3.

3.1 Minimum Required Technical and Other Special Qualifications

The contractor shall provide personnel with substantial knowledge and experience in the installation, operation and configuration of the DVS-G SVTC system. The knowledge and experience level of personnel proposed by the contractor shall indicate previous experience with these systems, or equivalents.

It is the responsibility of the Contractor to ensure that its employees or subcontractors who are supporting the effort described in this Statement of Work (SOW) have the required educational background, work experience, or a combination thereof to meet the technical objectives of the work specified in this SOW. The NRC will rely on representations made by the contractor concerning the qualifications of the personnel proposed, including assurance that all information contained in the technical and cost proposal, is accurate and truthful. All contractor team personnel shall be available to provide support under the contract until all final deliverables are accepted. The use of particular people on this project is subject to the NRC Project Manager's (PM) approval of their qualifications. This includes proposed changes to personnel during the life of the contract.

If any work will be subcontracted or performed by subcontractors or consultants, the Contractor shall obtain the NRC PM's written approval of the subcontractor or consultant prior to initiation of the subcontracted effort.

3.1.1 Clearances

A SECRET clearance is required for access to the SVTC systems and is preferred for the individuals performing this relocation. The Contractor must notify the PM if the qualified individuals who will be performing the upgrades do not have SECRET clearances, so that arrangements can be made for escorting and oversight during the relocation. Contractor personnel assigned to this project will be subject to NRC security screening requirements for access to NRC sensitive automated information systems and data, and for continuous unescorted access to NRC headquarters buildings. The individual performing SOVT must be cleared to the SECRET level.

3.1.2 Security Responsibilities

Although no access to the NRC network or cabling closets is anticipated, the Contractor shall support NRC's Network Security policies, particularly in protecting passwords and limiting access to cabling closets and common carrier demarcation locations.

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4.0 DELIVERABLES

The contractor shall provide:

1. A written relocation plan providing an overview of the anticipated actions and schedule at least 30 days prior to the relocation effort.
2. The contractor will provide a final report upon completion of the project.
3. Any documentation concerning configuration changes to the system.
4. A formal acceptance document for signature by site personnel and the Project Manager.

5.0 Principal Period of Operation (PPO)

For normal support at NRC, the PPO is defined as 0800 to 1700 Eastern Time, Monday through Friday, excluding government holidays for the NRC.

6.0 Contractor Supplied Materials and Services

The Contractor shall purchase all cables and software, etc., needed for the relocation of the SVTC systems. The Contractor shall furnish all personnel, supervision, and management required to perform under this contract. Supplies required for Contractor personnel to perform work on this contract shall be provided by the Contractor.

7.0 PROJECT MANAGEMENT

All work performed under this task shall be directed (technical direction only) by the NRC PM, James M. Dodmead or the Site Representative, Linda Howell, either under the provision of the basic contract or this SOW.

7.4 Staff Orientation

The Contractor shall educate their staff to the mission and organization of the NRC, the purpose and scope of the contract, and the Contractor's organization to accomplish the tasks in the contract. This orientation shall also ensure that Contractor staff is aware of acceptable behavior and performance standards. It shall emphasize that staff members are expected to take ownership of problems and work with users until the problem is successfully resolved, even if that involves coordinating with other Contractors or NRC organizations.

7.5 Performance and Conduct

The Contractor shall perform all work under this SOW in a skillful and professional manner in accordance with the standards and practices documented and/or accepted by industry or otherwise specified herein.

The Contractor shall certify to the PM that all personnel have been provided an orientation briefing on NRC policy and procedures and are aware of the expectations for appropriate conduct at the NRC.

7.6 Monthly Status Reports

The Contractor shall submit project status via the Basic Contract monthly status report to the NRC PM, not later than the 15th of the following month. The report shall provide a summary of accomplishments, projected completion of all ongoing activities, and an overview of activities planned for the following period in accordance with the SOW. The Monthly Report should contain, at a minimum, the following information:

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- Funds Expended and Remaining
- Objective
- Progress During Reporting Period
- Anticipated and Encountered Problem Areas
- Plans for the Next Reporting Period
- Any other items deemed necessary by the NRC Project Manager to monitor Contractor Performance

Submission via e-mail is acceptable.

7.7 Quality Assurance

The NRC is very concerned that the support supplied by the Contractor shall be of the highest possible quality. To ensure the highest possible quality, the Contractor shall address quality as an implied component of all other tasks and services requested in this SOW and delivered throughout the life of the contract. Workmanship performance for all Contractor efforts shall comply with current government and industry standards delineated in Section 9 of this document.

8.0 MEETINGS AND TRAVEL

Travel to the Region IV Office is required to relocate the DVS-G systems. All travel dates (except for local travel within 20 miles) must be approved by the NRC PM prior to commencement of the travel.

Travel approval must specify the following:

- Names of cities to be visited
- Number of trips to each city
- Expected length of each trip
- Number of people making each trip
- Purpose of each trip

9.0 PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

All work for this modification should commence upon award and be completed by January 31, 2011. This project may run as long as June 30, 2011, pending the exercise of Option Period 3.

10.0 GOVERNMENT-FURNISHED PROPERTY

The Contractor shall identify the type, amount and time frame for any required government resources.

11.0 TECHNICAL DIRECTION

Performance of work under this contract shall be subject to the technical direction of the NRC PM who will verbally and/or in writing provide information pertaining to the technical or

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functional environment or to specific requirements as necessary for performance of work under this task order.

The term "Technical Direction" is defined to include, without limitation, the following:

- Direction to the Contractor which redirects the contract effort, shifts work emphasis between work areas of tasks, requires pursuit of certain lines of inquiry fills in details or otherwise serves to accomplish contractual statement of work.
- Provision of information to the Contractor which assists in the interpretation of drawings, specifications or technical portions of the work description.
- The review and approval of technical reports, drawings, specifications and technical information to be delivered by the Contractor to the NRC under the contract.

12.0 DOCUMENTATION

The Contractor will provide the NRC all available documentation, software manuals, diagnostic routines, system configuration information, warranty information, equipment configurations and any other available information necessary to perform service under this contract.
