MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE ANSWER TO MOTION TO DISMISS AS MOOT THE ASPECTS OF CONTENTION 4 RELATED TO ACTIVE DEWATERING DURING LEVY NUCLEAR PLANT OPERATIONS

On September 29, 2010 this Board granted an extension of time in the above captioned matter for the filing of new or amended contentions on hydroecological issues to Nuclear Information and Resource Service, the Ecology Party of Florida and the Green Party of Florida (Co-Interveners) of 40 days. Co-Interveners are deeply appreciative of the recognition by this Board of the good cause shown in our Motion for Extension of Time, filed on September 24¹ and come now on the same grounds to ask for an extension of time for filing an Answer Brief to Progress Energy's September 30th filing of a Motion to Dismiss as Moot the Aspects of Contention 4 Relating to Active Dewatering.

The Motion from PEF was filed timely under a 40 day extension that was granted by this Board on August 20th in response to a request from all parties to enable more extended discussions of the issues. The scheduling order dictates that Co-Interveners have 20 days to respond to this dispositive Motion.

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¹ We will not repeat here all the details of medical hardship enumerated in the earlier filing, only affirming that the need for extension still exists on all the same grounds.

Co-Interveners ask an additional 40 days from the 20 day deadline for reply, or in the alternative, an extension to match the same calendar date as applies to filing amended or new contentions on hydroecology (November 13, 2010).

This extension is needed on the same basis as the current extension; further, such an extension would simplify the pleading of the issues at hand. Co-Interveners intend (in a separate Answer brief) to agree in part with the PEF Motion insofar as we agree that the DEIS differs from the Environment Report and Contention 4 should be updated by amendment to address the changes introduced in the DEIS. We do not agree with other assertions in the Motion, and will best plead this case with the participation of our expert.

Co-Interveners may require all of the time extension granted for our expert to support the filing of a Motion to Amend Contention 4. Such a filing would be integral to the Answer to the current PEF Motion and we are asking for this extension so that both pleadings may be filed together under the extended timeline that has been afforded for "good cause."

This Motion is hereby corrected to reflect consultation with other parties (correcting the error of not consulting prior to the original submission) with the following certification:

I certify that I have consulted with the other parties as of 4pm today and that both the applicant and NRC Staff have no objection to an extension of the time for filing an Answer to the PEF Motion to Dismiss to match the existing 40 day extension for filing new / amended contentions on hydro ecology (of November 13, 2010).
