Enclosed is Amendment No. 01 to your NRC Material License No. 24-32315-01 in accordance with your request dated September 1, 2010. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please note that we have reformatted Subitem Nos. 6, 7, and/or 9 and Condition No. 12 at this time to remove all references to excluded authorizations, including but not limited to authorizations such as "generators, xenon-133, aerosols, etc." Also, in accordance with current licensing policy, other changes to the Conditions in your license were made. Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

Please be advised that prior to performing positron emission tomography (PET) imaging, you will need to amend your NRC license to include shielding information of your facility and provide a copy of your shielding calculations that shows compliance 10 CFR Part 20, Radiation levels in unrestricted areas.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS, the NRC's electronic document system. Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31 and in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390, the enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability. 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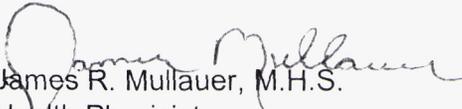
