Subject: Status update regarding remediation of 71 Shelton Avenue, New Haven, CT

On November 10, 2010, I conducted a status update phone call with Mr. Uruskyj and Mr. Bonito concerning the challenges regarding 1) the two access agreements and 2) one of the two profile approvals regarding Energy Solutions.

Regarding the access agreements, GE/UNC had a right of way access agreement with Olin but had allowed it to lapse. Instead of simply renewing the contract, Olin wanted to develop a new and different agreement, which will include an indemnity clause. The lawyers are almost finished with the legalities for the Olin access agreement. The other access agreement challenge is in regard to a residential property located adjacent to 71 Shelton Avenue, on the corner of Argyle and Shelton. This property is owned by a member of the public (individual) and the sewer to be remediated is on the property boundary line, which is delineated by a fence, owned by the individual. Mr. Uruskyj met with the individual and explained that GE/UNC was required to remediate the sewer and may need to access the property to effectively conduct the decommissioning activities. Mr. Uruskyj explained that GE/UNC may need to remove the fence and stated that any damage to the property, including replacement of the fence, would be restored to same condition or better. Mr. Uruskyj assumed that the individual was going to grant access, but as of November 10, 2010, has not been able to contact the individual. Mr. Uruskyj has left messages and sent letters regarding the agreement. Mr. Uruskyj stated to Ms. Kauffman that he was going to go to New Haven next week and attempt to contact the property owner one more time. Mr. Uruskyj asked Ms. Kauffman if he could provide my name and phone number to the individual in the event the individual had and questions or felt the need to confirm the validity of the request. Ms. Kauffman agreed to Mr. Uruskyj providing the individual with her contact information.

Regarding the profile approvals, Mr. Uruskyj stated that Cabrera received the radioactive soil and debris profile approval from Energy Solutions and is still waiting for the approval for the mixed waste profile.

Action Required: Contact GE/UNC Naval November 30, 2010 for another update.

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
