day (annual average) for production purposes. The EMP shall be approved and implemented a

minimum of one-year prior to initial use of the first production well in excess of 100,000 gallons

per day (annual average) for production purposes."

The EMP has not been submitted yet.

Did you provide the Conditions for Certification? DEP writes the COC's however SWFWMD contributed to the COC's that pertain to groundwater use.

If you did, did you use the original groundwater modeling data submitted by the applicant or did you use the revised, "recalibrated"

model that the applicant completed after the initial review process was completed? We used the most recent modeling information as the final impact analysis

If you reviewed the re-calibrated model, can you tell me when that re-calibrated model was submitted and reviewed and how the re-calibrated model was reviewed? This information is available in the File of Record. The model was evaluated using Groundwater Vistas software.
