By letter dated August 12, 2010 (Reference 2), Union Electric Company (dba Ameren Missouri) resubmitted a request for amendment of the facility Operating License for Callaway, including a request for approval of Callaway's proposed Cyber Security Plan. By subsequent letter dated September 27, 2010 (Reference 3), Ameren Missouri responded to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) Order to clarify "balance-of-plant" systems, structures, and components (SSCs) in the Callaway Cyber Security Plan. In that letter, Ameren Missouri stated that the revised Callaway Cyber Security Plan will be submitted to the NRC on or before November 30, 2010, consistent with the North America Electric Reliability Corporation's (NERC's) expectation.

In a recent eMail letter from NERC (Reference 1), NERC acknowledges that the NRC is addressing the issue of regulatory jurisdiction over continuity-of-power, balance-of-plant SSCs and that the NRC staff will articulate the Commission's decision in the near future. The letter further states that NERC expects each licensee to provide its updated cyber security plan in accordance with a schedule to be provided by the NRC.

Consistent with the revised NERC expectation, Ameren Missouri will provide a supplement to the Callaway Cyber Security Plan (proposed per Reference 2) in accordance with a schedule to be provided by the NRC. This new schedule to provide a supplement to the NRC replaces the prior schedule to supplement the Callaway Cyber Security Plan on or before November 30, 2010.

This letter does not contain new commitments.
