Alan:

In response to your email, I wanted to cite the approved jurisdictional determination that supports this statement that the Great Divide Basin (GDB) contains no jurisdictional waters. I could not find that document. Our Senior Project Manager told me that such a document does not exist. This is a blanket statement that had been applied to the GDB because it is considered a hydrographically closed basin.

According to our current jurisdictional determination (JD) procedures, a JD must be made on a site by site basis, and any isolated waters (non-jurisdictional) determination must be coordinated with EPA and be subject to appeal.

So, generally, it is likely that there are no waters of the U.S. in the Great Divide Basin, but in order to confirm and document this, an approved jurisdictional determination (AJD) for a specific project area within the GDB must be requested by the landowner (or applicant on behalf of the landowner).
