**Subject:** NEXT SGIT Meeting

Good Evening,

I apologize for the late notice, but had a project selection meeting the last two days in Hulett.

The next meeting of the team will be held Tuesday, 15 June, at the Best Western Inn at Lander, beginning at 9 am. You have all done a tremendous job getting us where we are, and this meeting will hopefully finalize our assignment, and lead to the meeting with the Governor on 29 June in Cheyenne. As such, we will not have time for extensive philosophical waxing, and I will try to keep us on task and get the meeting done in good order.

There are four agenda items:

1. Finalization of the map review: In general, the mapping exercise is completed, with a few exceptions that I will ask you to review in Lander. I do not intend to spend much time on this - you did a superb job of analyzing these issues last time - but there are some areas that we need to re-discuss, with further input from the local working groups (LWGs). As far as I can tell at this time, those are:

- Delaney Rim (SELWG - Rawlins)
- Chokecherry Wind (SELWG - Rawlins)
- Shirley Basin Wind (CBCLWG - Casper)
- Beaver Rim Wind (WRSWLWG - Lander)
- Connectivity (NELWG - Gillette)
- Wintering Areas (UGRLWG - Pinedale)

2. Process and Stipulations: I will send you the final revision of the completed document this weekend (tomorrow, I hope). This is the main meeting item, and we will hear from everyone on changes they recommend. I would remind you that much of this has already been put in place, so will likely not entertain revisions to existing stipulations without VERY GOOD reason. Honestly, I think we have this hammered to a point where it will go fairly well.

We will work from the comprehensive document I send you, and I would ask you to review more for content than grammar, please.

3. Conveyance Letter: I will send you a DRAFT of the letter I intend to send to the Governor on your behalf, which outlines a number of issues, and again, I would ask that you look at this in the context of content. There is no way 20 people can wordsmith this letter, and I want to get the key points made in a manner that will

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provide a history, direction, and clear picture of your intent that can be carried forward. Again, please look at this in the larger context, and try not to wordsmith.

4. Other Issues: I would like to save at least an hour to discuss other issues that you would like to raise in the conveyance letter. These would include funding recommendations, priorities for action, research needs, and other ideas you would like to convey to the Governor. I would really like to have a couple of hours for this, but that depends on how we work through the other agenda items.

We will present the results to the Governor on the 29th at 10 am in Cheyenne. I hope you can all make that meeting. I would ask you to hold the 28th open for a meeting (if needed) in Cheyenne to finalize any of these issues.

Thank you again for your hard work, your participation in the process, and your dedication to the State of Wyoming. It is an honor to work with you.

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
