Long ago, Shawn. They turned over these buildings in the mid 1990's . City of Seattle now owns it as part of Magnuson Park. Someone working for the city discovered an old 1939 -1945 map that had one of the rooms in the old float plane hangar south shack labeled "the Radium room" The city investigated and discovered radium 226 in one of the pipes that was disconnected from a sink which had been removed. The Navy hired Shaw. We've inspected and seen them in action removing a second pipe in another hanger and they are VERY competent.

In good Navy style, the clean up was swabbing the decks with plenty of water and so they started the cleanup at the radium paint and mopped it into the wooden sub floors and joists, all the way down the hall of the offices. This was hidden by subsequent remodeling and discovered when scoping surveys were performed by Shaw. The job expanded exponentially. They are finishing the scoping the end of this month. The Navy then has to plan and budget for the remediation work. Shaw will perform ongoing surveillance of the 2 hangers and contaminated soil.
