Hello Andrew:

Just to clarify:

There are six residences on Park-owned property. All are currently occupied. They tend to always be occupied as Sarah describes (i.e. when someone moves out, someone else moves in).

Two residences on Adams Key. One is required residency, a law enforcement ranger and his family. The other is currently occupied by a Maintenance employee and his family.

Two residences on Elliott Key. Both are required residency for law enforcement rangers and their families.

Two residences on the mainland, at Convoy Point by Headquarters. One is required residency for a law enforcement officer and his family. The other is volunteer housing and can house four people, and is usually full.

Each residence has two bedrooms so it can house up to four people (five or six if there are a lot of children, I suppose).

There is a residence here for rangers. The same ranger lives in that house as long as he/she is employed (more than one year). So yes the same person or person and their family lives there year round. If that person were to leave for a new job a new ranger would be hired and would move in or another ranger and/or family would be moved into the housing so that there is always a ranger living on site on the mainland. This is also true for Elliot Key and for Adams Key. Is this clear? Hope it helps.
