Re: Global Laser Enrichment Facility


Dear Ira,

I'm writing to comment about ANI's intention to insure the Global Laser Enrichment (GLE) facility in Wilmington, North Carolina.

In a September 30th letter to GE Hitachi, I advised that ANI expects to write nuclear liability insurance for the GLE facility. Coverage in fact already is in place under Facility Form Policy No. NF-0169, which currently insures the fuel manufacturing facilities at Wilmington and which has a limit of liability of \$200 million.

Although ongoing coverage for the GLE facility is subject to a satisfactory engineering evaluation, ANI does anticipate that we will insure the facility. We do not anticipate increasing the limit of liability beyond its current \$200 million. That limit will apply both for the fuel manufacturing and enrichment operations. The fuel manufacturing operation creates a legacy exposure that restricts how much insurance capacity we're willing to offer. Our current underwriting position is that we will not increase capacity beyond an insured facility's existing policy limit. For NF-0169, that limit is \$200 million. Our position is unlikely to change in the foreseeable future.
