1. Because of the Christmas holiday, little information of this plan has become public knowledge in my area. The Public Comment Period ends just before another major holiday and it is doubtful many citizens are aware of the opportunity to make comments. Therefore, I request the Public Comment Period be extended an additional 60 days.

2. The plan to bring in 1000 tons of nuclear radioactive waste from Germany to be incinerated and stored/landfilled over the next five years is unacceptable. America has its own waste pollution disposal problems. Yucca Mountain has not been approved for disposal of radioactive wastes. Why should this country assume the burden of waste disposal for Germany? As Tennessee's Congressman Bart Gordon has said, "If a country like Germany has the capacity to produce large quantities of nuclear waste, it should also have the capacity to treat it and store it....I am concerned once that waste is imported, nothing but an individual corporation's word prevents it from being shipped to U.S. disposal sites."

3. Violations of NRC and state environmental regulatory laws are commonplace and Civil and Criminal Penalties do little to thwart illegal activity. A case in point is what happened over a twelve year period (1980-1991) regarding uranium contaminated waste from Martin Marietta Energy Systems, Inc., a federal nuclear weapons plant in Oak Ridge, TN, that was sent to Alabama for disposal.

4. It is my understanding that Energy Solutions of Oak Ridge plans to incinerate the German nuclear waste. In order to address this issue and to make acceptable and informed comments, the public needs more time to get information about the company's background and experience.
