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

CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Good afternoon everybody. Let's go on the record now with the reporter if we can. I am Judge Ryerson. With me is Hillary Cain, the Board's law clerk. And we have, I believe

in Utah, Judge Jackson.

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ADMIN. JUDGE JACKSON: That's correct. CHAIRMAN RYERSON: In Hawaii, Judge Garcia.

We obviously have the reporter on line. We have made lines available for the public or the media, anyone who wanted to listen in on this proceeding. I don't believe anyone has called in for information on how to do to that. But be aware that that is a possibility.

With that said, and I know we've just done this apparently without the reporter but could we go through, again, for the record, the counsel introductions or introduction of anyone else who may be speaking on the call, starting with the Applicant, Mr. Silverman.

MR. SILVERMAN: Yes, good afternoon. This is Don Silverman. I'm with the Law Firm of Morgan,

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1	Lewis & Bockius. And we represent GE-Hitachi Global
2.	Laser Enrichment.
3	MR. O'NEAL: This is Martin O'Neal. I'm
4	also an attorney with Morgan, Lewis, co-counsel to the
5	Applicant and Mr. Silverman.
`6	MS. OLIVIER: This is Julie Olivier. I'm
7	a licensing manager for Global Laser Enrichment. And
8	with me is Juliet Bryant, the licensing engineer for
· 9	Global Laser Enrichment.
10	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: I guess we move then to
11	the staff. Is there anyone else for the Applicant?
12	MR. SILVERMAN: There is not.
13	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay. Thank you.
14	The staff, NRC staff.
15	MS. SAFFORD: Good afternoon. It's Carrie
16	Safford. I'm with the Office of General Counsel and
17	I have some other staff members here. I'll let them
18	introduce themselves.
19	MR. JOHNSON: Tim Johnson, I'm the
20	licensing project manager for the project.
21	MR. SMITH: Brian Smith, Acting Deputy
22	Director, Division of Fuel Cycle Safety and
23	Safeguards.
24	MR. FRAZIER: This is Alan Frazier, the
25	Acting Uranium Enrichment Branch Chief.
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· 1	MS. DAVIS: Jennifer Davis, Environmental	
2	Project Manager.	
3	MR. HSUEH: Kevin Hsueh, Chief	
4	Environmental Review Branch, NRC.	
· 5	MS. SAFFORD: And that's it for NRC staff.	· · ·
6	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay. Thank you.	
7	Well, welcome everyone. The purpose of	
8	today's call, which I think will be a fairly brief one	
9	is to discuss necessary revisions to our September 13	
-10	initial scheduling order in light of changes to the	
11	NRC staff's schedule for both the SER and the FEIS.	
12	And I'd like to begin with a few questions	
13	for the staff. Should these be addressed to you, Ms.	
14	Safford in the first instance?	
15	MS. SAFFORD: Yes, please.	
16	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay. First, how firm	
17	is the current estimate of April for both of the staff	
18	documents? Is that reasonably firm now? Or still	
19	subject to change?	
20	MS. SAFFORD: My understanding is that it	
21	is reasonably firm. On the environmental side, I	
22	believe we have all the information in-house now that	
23	we need.	
24	And on the safety review side of the	
25	house, my understanding is that we have most of the	
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1	information. There is perhaps just one other
2	outstanding issue that we're acquiring information.
3	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay. And what is your
4	best guess, if you can, as to when in April these
5	documents might come out? Towards the beginning of
6	the month? Towards the end of the month? Really
7	can't say now. Do we have a sense?
8	MS. SAFFORD: My best guess would be the
9	end of the month.
10	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: The end of the month.
11	MS. SAFFORD: Yes.
12	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: And is there any
.13	likelihood of any staggering at all of the releases
14	here? Or you are expecting to pretty much issue both
15	documents at the same time?
16	MS. SAFFORD: Probably about the same
17	time. I mean there could be they're not timed
18	together. We wouldn't purposely issue them on the
19	same day. It's just as soon as they're done, we'll
20	issue them.
21	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Right. The reason I
22	ask is that initially everyone sort of had the benefit
23	of a staggered schedule that would allow us to review
24	one document and start working up questions on it.
25	And get those out to everyone while the other document
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was still being prepared.

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But it sounds like most likely, unless you, in fact, have some sort of unexpected difficulty with the SER, that they will come out pretty much the same time at this point.

MS. SAFFORD: Yes, that's correct. 6 7 CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay. All right. And if I recall, the staff's initial sense, some months 8 9 ago, was that the SER itself would not have any kind 10 of classified appendix to it or anything like that 11 that, that you were hoping to complete the SER without explicitly referring to any classified material or 12 13 information. Is that -- A, is my recollection correct? And B, is that still the case? 14 15 MS. SAFFORD: Yes, on both counts. 16 CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay. 17 MS. SAFFORD: That's still our expectation 18

PARTICIPANT: And we'd have a non-public and a public --

CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay. Thank you.

21 CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Well, let me tell you 22 where the Board is at this point. I think we have not 23 had any formal meetings amongst ourselves. We've 24 tried to communicate a little bit in anticipation of 25 this call.

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And I think we had a consensus on a couple

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First, despite our optimism that you will have both documents out in April, perhaps the next scheduling order should be more generic in the sense that we will key dates to the last filed staff documents so that if you do slip into May or whatever, the order will be self-correcting. And we don't have to really change it.

The other thought we had was that given what is now, I guess, essentially a four month slippage for the SER, that we should consider trying to compress our earlier schedule a little bit to at least bring it within maybe eight months or so of the last staff document, last issued staff document, so that we're still well ahead of the deadline that the Commission set in its order.

18 You may recall, I believe it was something 19 like 28-and-a-half months from the Commission's order, 20 which would take us to mid-May 2012. So allowing for 21 any further delay in the staff documents and allowing 22 for potential problems with classified information, if we decide in our review that it is necessary to address that in some way, we would really like to at least target completing the mandatory hearing in this

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Does that seem like a good target to the Applicant and to the staff? And first the Applicant, does that sound like a good objective on our part?

MR. SILVERMAN: This is Don Silverman, Your Honor. It is a good objective. We took a look – - we, the Applicant, at the prior schedule in your scheduling order, and then we put a strawman together for ourselves, which we have shared with the staff on, you know, what might be the schedule now of all the various milestones -- the same milestones as before, as in your order.

CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Right.

MR. SILVERMAN: Assuming an SER and FEIS issue date of the April 30th, just going through that with the strawman approach, we came up with a Board initial decision of January 31st, 2012, which is close to what you are suggesting.

We would certainly be happy to go back and look at that and see if there was a way to further compress that a bit. I would say that in doing this, we pretty much adhered to the same kinds of time frames that you established in your original order, kind of moving things day for day, pretty close to that.

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CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Well, you know, that's -- I must say as we tried to figure out where time could come out both on the time periods that apply to the Board as well as time periods that apply to the parties, it was a little tough trying to squeeze it. And I think maybe -- maybe January 31,

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which is about a month longer than we were shooting for, is not a bad idea. That gives us a little bit more time. And still provides, hopefully, what is an ample cushion on that May 2012 date from the Commission that we very much obviously want to honor.

What do you think is the best way to proceed then? Would you like to submit that as a joint proposal from the Applicant and the staff? Or shall we just try to modify our earlier order in some fashion?

We probably should have the benefit of what you and the staff think is the best -- the best way to cut these same milestones with a little less time involved.

21 MR. SILVERMAN: This is Mr. Silverman. If 22 you don't mind, I propose that we could do what I 23 believe we did the last time, if I remember correctly, 24 and Ms. Safford can correct me if I'm wrong, but that 25 we could submit, the Applicant, our proposed schedule.

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1	And I believe there was an opportunity
2	am I right, Carrie, for the staff to comment on that?
3	MS. SAFFORD: That's correct, right.
4	MR. SILVERMAN: And, you know, just from
5	our initial discussions, I don't think we're very far
6	off with each other. But you may have some comments.
7	So we'd be more than happy to submit a
8	proposed schedule or a proposed order, give the staff
9	an opportunity to look at that and comment on it. And
10	then the Board could act on it.
11	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay. I mean that, I
12	think, makes sense from our standpoint.
13	How much time would you want, Mr.
14	Silverman, to submit your proposed order?
<sub>.</sub> 15	MR. SILVERMAN: Oh, well we could do that-
16	- bear with me one second let's see, today is the
17	20th. I think we could do that by about a week the
18	27th or the 28th at the latest.
19	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay. Let's make that
20	January 28th then. And the staff, how long would you
21	like to respond?
22	MS. SAFFORD: We'll just need a few days,
23	Your Honor. We've already discussed it briefly with
24	Applicant's counsel.
25	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay. We'll let's make
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1	it a similar time period then? That would take us to
2	February I don't have a calendar in front of but
3	February 4 or 5?
4	MS. SAFFORD: February 4 is the following
5	Friday. That would be fine.
6	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: February 4. All right.
7	Very good. So let's plan on that.
8	And, you know, again, I if for some
. 9	reason both either the Applicant or the staff
10	prefer having hard dates as opposed to kind of generic
11	dates from, you know, X days from an initiating event,
12	we'll leave it to your choice on that.
13	I do suggest that we may be able to just
14	avoid changing things if it is kind of generic instead
15	of going from specific dates. But I don't think the
16	Board members have a strong preference on that.
17	Let me see what else we had. Oh, yes, we
18	had talked about a site visit potentially in February.
19	And I think the Board members' thinking is that that
20	would be most useful if we've had an opportunity to
21	look at the SER. And we might then, frankly, be able
22	to use the time among Board members to have a
23	discussion as well as to see the site.
24	So I think we're thinking now perhaps the
25	week of May 23rd. Unless someone sees a problem with
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1	that now, we'll give it some further thought. And if
2	we want to move forward with that at a later point, we
3	can have the Board's law clerk contact people about
4	setting that up as a firm date.
5	Does that date pose any problem for anyone
6	that you are aware of at this point? The week of May
7	23rd?
8	MS. SAFFORD: As far as I know, that's
. 9	okay with staff.
10	MS. OLIVIER: Yes, this is Julie Olivier
11	from GOE, that should be fine for us here at the site.
12	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay. We'll count on
13	that as a possibility then. And as I said, we'll be
14	getting back to the parties on that a little bit
15	later.
16	You know one thing, and this will
17	obviously be probably repeated in whatever final order
18	comes out, as we stressed earlier, this schedule is
19	going to be dependent upon a number of factors that
20	are not necessarily in the Board's control. And part
21	of that will be the quality of responses to the
22	questions that we have.
23	And another part of it may be the need to
24	be addressing, in some sort of public way, well
25	presumably not in a public way, but the need to be
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1	addressing the specifics of classified information.
2	So we'll have to just so that everyone is aware of
3	that but subject to those concerns, you know, I think
4	we are still hopefully on track to complete this
5	proceeding well before the date that the Commission
6	has set as a target.
7	Is there anything else that anyone
8	first either of my fellow judges, anything that we
9	have not discussed that you would like to raise right
10	now?
11	Judge Jackson, anything?
12	ADMIN. JUDGE JACKSON: This is Judge
13	Jackson. I have no further questions.
14	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay.
15	Judge Garcia?
16	ADMIN. JUDGE GARCIA: This is Judge
17	Garcia. No comments or questions at this time.
18	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay.
19	For the Applicant, anything we should be
20	addressing today while we're all together?
21	MR. SILVERMAN: This is Mr. Silverman.
22	I'm not aware of anything else.
23	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Okay.
24	And finally the staff?
25	MS. SAFFORD: Nothing here, Your Honor.
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1	CHAIRMAN RYERSON: Very good. Well, thank	
2	you. Then we stand adjourned.	
3	(Whereupon, the above-entitled meeting of
