Enclosed is Amendment No. 37 to your NRC Material License No. 24-00196-07 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

This also refers to my letter to you dated June 29, 2009, transmitting Amendment No. 36, in which I requested a written response addressing the following information. To date, we have not received your response.

Please note that, since I originally sent this request to you, our requirements for listing possession limits on licenses have changed further and we will need definite possession limits for the additional materials specified.

A hard copy of this document should have been sent to you already. Please refer to Table 1, Attachment 2, page 19 of 19, especially and note the activity thresholds listed for materials commonly included in 10 CFR 35.400, 35.500 and 35.1000.

At this time, please specify the "per radionuclide" and total possession limits you want to have for your authorizations in 10 CFR 35. 300 (possession limit needed for iodine-131 only), 400, 35.500, and 31.11 (total possession limit only needed). We must now review license applications and prepare license documents in accordance with this RIS and the requested information is necessary to complete that review.

Please provide this information within 30 days of the date of this letter, in writing, addressed to my attention and reference it as "additional information to control no. 573753."

Please also note that I readjusted the last Condition of your license to <u>delete the</u> <u>documents pertaining to your Increased Controls and Fingerprinting Orders responses, that I added in Amendment No. 36, issued on June 29, 2009.</u> I misunderstood whether
