Dear Ms. Case:

This refers to a routine safety and security inspection conducted on February 2 and 3, 2011, by Randolph Ragland of this office conducted at the above address and at a field site, located at 1101 K. Street, Washington, D.C., of activities authorized by the above listed NRC license. A representative of the Commonwealth of Virginia, Mr. Asfaw Fenta, observed the onsite portion of the inspection. The inspection consisted of an examination of your licensed activities as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Commission's regulations and the license conditions. Additional information regarding work in areas of NRC jurisdiction was provided in a telephone conversation on March 8, 2011, between you and Gary Kolbenstetter of your organization and this office was also examined as part of the inspection. The findings of the inspection were discussed with Gary Kolbenstetter of your organization at the conclusion of the inspection on March 16, 2011.

Based on the results of the inspection, the NRC identified security-related violation(s), which are documented in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). The violation(s) were evaluated in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy and are categorized at Severity Level (SL) IV. The Enforcement Policy is included on the NRC's website at www.nrc.gov; select **About NRC; How We Regulate; Enforcement; then Enforcement Policy**. The violation(s) are cited in the enclosed Notice because the violation(s) were identified by the NRC. Information regarding the basis for the circumstances, the reason the violation(s) occurred, and corrective actions taken, is addressed in Enclosure 2.

You are required to respond to this letter and should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice when preparing your response. For your consideration, review the NRC Information Notice 96-28, "Suggested Guidance Relating to Development and Implementation

The NRC will use your response, in part, to determine whether further enforcement action is necessary to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements.

Because this issue involves security-related information, your response will not be made available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room of the NRC’s document system (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html>. Mark your entire response “Security Related – Withhold under 10 CFR 2.390.” In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC’s “Rules of Practice,” a copy of this letter will be made available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the NRC’s Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC website at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html>. However, because of the Security-Related information contained in the enclosures, and in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390, the enclosures will be withheld from public disclosure.
