Hi Richard,

I left you a voicemail message as well.

When I sent the initial submission on 12/28/10, it included the NRC Form 313, which shows in Section 1 that PerkinElmer Downers Grove Illinois was only renewing our license (ref. attached copy of the 313 Form).

I could give further verbiage as to why I sent what you have, but the short of it is, I'm not 100% sure what all, in terms of every exempt source, is on our license.

Although I have most all past license amendments that should show what was included in them at the time they were valid, they reference past letters, which I don't have, except for the ones I personally sent you in the last 10 years I've been here.

Is there any way I can obtain a list of what all is currently on our exempt license? If I had that, I believe I would go for the first option you cited, and submit the renewal application with any relevant additions & their associated documentation.

Note; I believe this is what you are saying needs to be done at this point, but if not, then we should discuss by phone.

Mr. Haines:

We have received your letter of February 18, 2011. In response to our Request for Additional Information (RAI). In retrospect, I think I should have provided you with more details about the options for renewal of an exempt-distribution license.

When a licensee chooses to submit an entirely new application for renewal as if it were an application for a new license, without referring to previously submitted information, it is expected that the submission will consist of all the information required by the applicable sections of 10 CFR Part 32 (for your license, sections 32.18 and 32.19), as though it had not been previously provided to the NRC.

However, this is not your only option. As stated in our RAI of January 31, 2011, you may choose to:

- Review the current license to determine if it accurately represents the current radiation safety program and the products currently distributed, and submit an application that identifies any necessary additions, deletions, or other changes; or
- Review the documents submitted to the NRC in the past to determine if the information is up to date and accurately represents the current licensed activities and products. Identify in the application, by date, those documents that are applicable and those that are out-of-date or superseded, and indicate any changes necessary to reflect the current program.

These two options are very similar; I don't know why they are considered separate options, but they provide considerable flexibility with regard to how you can respond. Please review the products and the documents listed on your license, and provide the appropriate information in accordance with the above options. You provided a list of products, but did not state whether (or how) this list differs from the products currently authorized by your license.

Also, please submit a signed and dated copy of Form 313.
