Enclosed is Amendment No. 08 to your NRC Material License No. 21-26099-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

Please note that we changed the formatting of License Condition No. 11 and updated License Condition No. 18 as appeared in Amendment No. 07 of your NRC Material License. These changes were made to conform to our standard format for our material licenses and should have no impact on your radiation safety program.

We also added License Condition No. 13. F to you license as it appears in this current amendment. This condition requires that leak test records be retained for a period of 3 years.

Lastly we removed License Conditions Nos. 17 and 21 as they appeared on Amendment No 07. Both of these conditions are considered redundant. License Condition No. 18 is redundant now that License Condition No.15 was added to your license during your latest amendment and Condition No. 21 is no longer needed since your license now has possession limits. Some of the above changes required renumbering of license conditions in your license.

In accordance with 10 Code of Federal Regulations 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosure will be available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC Web site at http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.

Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
