Subject: Change of Ownership Notification

Dear Sir or Madam:

The purpose of this correspondence is to communicate that an Asset Purchase Agreement has been signed whereby substantially all the assets of Central Indiana Cancer Centers (CICC) will be acquired by Clarian Health Partners, d/b/a Indiana University Health, Inc. (IUH). The change of ownership from CICC to IUH is planned for May 1, 2011. The transferor and transferee agree to the change of ownership of the licensed materials and the conditions of the transfer. There are no open inspection items pending for this license. The transferee accepts responsibility for the license and conditions as they exist upon the date of transfer.

Below you will find additional information specified by regulatory requirements.

Change of Ownership commitment requirements:

1. The new name and address for the license will be Indiana University Health Hematology & Oncology Clinic, 1346 E. County Line Road, Indianapolis, IN 46227 effective with the amendment processing.

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3. There are no changes to the personnel controlling the radioactive material or license locations. Specifically, the Executive Director, RSO, and Authorized Users for this license will be the same as currently identified on the license, license conditions or application.
4. The transferor will not remain in business as part of this license or in this use of radioactive material subsequent to the planned transfer on May 1, 2011.
5. IUH, a not-for-profit corporation, intends to acquire substantially all assets of CICC. The day-to-day management of CICC operations, as well as the management team, will remain unchanged; however, governing responsibilities will rest with the Board of Directors of IUH. Said purchase is expected to be effective May 1, 2011, pursuant to the NRC's consent of this license amendment.
6. Except for the change in ownership, there are no planned changes in the organization, location, facilities, equipment, procedures or personnel that would require a license amendment. No other changes in personnel, processes, or equipment are occurring that would require a change to the current emergency procedures.
7. There are no changes planned or pending in the use, possession, location or storage of the licensed materials.
8. There are no changes in the organization, location, facilities, equipment, procedures or personnel that would require a license amendment even without transferring of control.
9. All surveillance items and records (e.g., calibrations, leak tests, surveys, inventories, and accountability requirements) are current and will be current at the time of transfer.
10. Records will be kept on site in the current locations. We confirm that all records concerning the safe and effective decommissioning of the facilities; public dose; and waste disposal by release to sewers, incineration, radioactive material spills, and on-site burials, will be maintained on site and in the possession of the new licensee in accordance with applicable regulations.
11. The facilities are still in operation as allowed under the license. Activities on site are well below the license limits. Weekly, monthly and quarterly surveys demonstrate that contamination levels are well below any working regulatory limits.
12. There are no plans to conduct decontamination efforts since the current levels are minimal. The current uses and amounts do not require any special financial assurance requirements. The transferee accepts full liability for the licensed use areas in the condition that they are found during the process of changing the ownership.

13. The transferee agrees to abide by all commitments and representations previously made to NRC by the transferor. These include, but are not limited to: maintaining decommissioning records, implementing decontamination activities and decommissioning of the site, and completing corrective actions for open inspection items and enforcement actions.

The transferor commits to decontaminate the facilities before transfer of control. However, no contamination will be present at the time of transfer (item 11) and no decontamination will need to be performed (item 12).

Currently, there are no open inspection items or enforcement actions. Transferor commits to address and close out any future inspection or enforcement actions that arise prior to May 1, 2011 (the intended date of this transfer). Transferee shall accept full responsibility for inspection or enforcement actions arising on or after May 1, 2011.

14. Transferor and transferee agree to transfer control of the licensed material and activity, and the conditions of transfer. Transferee is aware of all open inspection items and its responsibility for possible resulting enforcement actions.

15. Transferee commits to abide by all constraints, conditions, requirements, representations, and commitments identified in the existing license.
