14:45 Mr. Van Arsdall was not in the office. I spoke to the receptionist who stated that Mr. Van Arsdall was involved in a project which was due today and he would get back to me at the earliest opportunity.
4/6/2011 09:30 I spoke with Mr. Van Arsdall. We went over the procedures necessary to terminate the license. It was noted that Amendment No. 2 referred to Hewlett Packard 18803-60520 and Varian 01-001028-01 ECD. The HP unit was sent back to the manufacturer according to Mr. Van Arsdall but he would have to check his records about the Varian since it "was before my time." The Sealed Source and Device Registration Record indicates that the device can be generally licensed (CA-662-D-101-B). I asked Mr. Van Arsdall to contact the manufacturer's successor to determine if there was a record documenting the transfer. Mr. Van Arsdall agreed to send in a termination request with whatever information he could regarding these devices.
