PROGRAM SCOPE							

This was a follow-up inspection of activities performed under this license. This inspection was being performed 12 months after an initial inspection could not be completed on March 3, 2010, because the licensee had not begun principal activities.

Since the previous inspection, the licensee changed their location of use from Livonia to Detroit, Michigan. The licensee's intention remained to provide diagnostic nuclear medicine services to a clinic, but had to move because the intended clinic had ceased operations before the licensee could begin offering services. The previous location of use was successfully surveyed and removed from the NRC license.

The licensee currently occupies two rooms in a mixed-use medical practice facility. This inspection was unable to be completed because the licensee had still not begun licensed operations or seen any patients at the new location. Additionally, the licensee's Radiation Safety Officer and lone Authorized User was unavailable at the time of the inspection, and maintained the only keys to the licensee's rooms. The licensee's consultant informed the inspector that the licensee possessed reference sources of radioactive materials that would be used for routine instrument calibration.

In accordance with the memo dated March 29, 2011, the next inspection date is set at four months because the licensee had not begun licensed operations for the second consecutive inspection.

Performance Observations

The inspector verified that the doors to the licensee's rooms were secured. An interview with the consultant identified that reference sources of radioactive material were stored in a double pad-locked cabinet within the locked camera room. The consultant stated that a "Caution: Radioactive Materials" sign had been stolen from the camera room door since her last visit approximately two weeks prior to the inspection.

The inspector discussed the licensee's intentions with the consultant, and reminded her of the timeliness rule requirements in Title 10 of the Code of Federal Regulations Section 30.36(d). If the licensee does not conduct any principal activities within 24 months after taking possession of the reference sources mentioned above, they may be required to notify the NRC, in writing, within 60 days of that occurrence.
