Dear Mrs. Lanzisera:


Regarding the items identified, on **Item # 4** Posting/Labeling in the Nuclear Medicine Department, I was trying to explain that the corrective actions were implemented as recommended. Please refer to the following paragraph:

"The inspector recommended that the posting of Radiation Material be changed. This was done immediately. The postings were replaced with new ones that read *Caution Radioactive Area*. The labeling protocols in the Nuclear Medicine Laboratory were reviewed with the Nuclear Medicine Technologists. *The shielded containers and the syringes that are being used for radioactive residual are also now identified with a radioactive label*".

When I mentioned *shielded containers and the syringes*, I was referring to the word **syringes** pertaining the holders containing syringes with radioactive material that were identified with a Radioactive Material label. The phrase **shielded containers** refers to the area where the containers of radioactive material are kept to be return to the Radiopharmacy. This area was posted with the sign "Caution Radioactive Materials.

I apologize for this inconvenience and hope this clarifies the misunderstanding.
