Enclosed is Amendment No. 44 to your NRC Material License No. 24-05245-01 in accordance with your request dated October 22, 2010. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

Please be advised that prior to performing positron emission tomography (PET) imaging, you will need to amend your NRC license to include shielding information of your facility and provide a copy of your shielding calculations that shows compliance 10 CFR Part 20, Radiation levels in unrestricted areas.


Please note that in accordance with current licensing policy, your authorization for 10 CFR 35.300 has been reworded. For iodine-131 use, your physicians authorized for 35.300 material are limited to the administration of 33 millicuries or less.

Also please note that your possession limit for materials authorized by 10 CFR 31.11. If you will need additional 31.11 material, you will need to amend your NRC license.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
