Dear Dr. Goraya:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 22 to your NRC Material License No. 21-26399-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the major changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

**This also refers to the change of ownership transaction described in the letter dated December 28, 2010, which occurred on January 1, 2011, and required an amendment to the license for a change in the licensed name.**

**NRC hereby consents to the transaction as described in your letter dated December 28, 2010.**

Please note that, at this time, I updated the authorizations on your license in Subitem Nos. 6. through 9.B, inclusive, and Condition No. 12.B. to reflect that this authorization is under 10 CFR 35.500. These changes resulted in the deletion of Condition Nos. 13, 14 and 15, as they appeared on Amendment No. 21. A re-ordering and re-numbering of License Conditions that followed these Conditions also resulted.

In addition I removed the restrictions on authorizations for Drs. Girard, Dodds, Goraya, and Vedala, as we can no longer continue restrictions such as "limited to cardiovascular clinical procedures" on NRC licenses under revised 10 CFR Part.35. These physicians are still restricted in their authorization, based upon documents in Condition No. 15.

Your letter dated December 28, 2011, contained discrepancies that related to your NRC license, as follows:

Item 4 of your letter referred to "Elliot" Drive and "Suite 203" but Condition No. 10 of your license refers to "Elliott" Drive and "Suite 202" and Subitem No. 2 refers to "Suite 203" - please advise us, in writing in a future amendment, as to which designations are correct; and,

The enclosed document contains sensitive security-related information.  
When separated from this cover letter this letter is uncontrolled.

**Item 4 of your letter did not reference a suite number for the Brighton, Michigan facility but your NRC license refers to "Suite 210" for the Brighton Michigan facility – please advise us as to which is correct, in writing, in a future amendment.**

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS, the NRC's electronic document system.

Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.

Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
