Steven, I need to ask you a question about this incident to understand how it meets the AO criteria. Did the dose to the bladder exceed 1,000 rad of what was expected from a correct implant procedure. I understand that the bladder probably didn't get 50% greater than expected, but the seeds were delivered to the wrong treatment site. If the dose to the bladder (even though the seeds were removed) exceeded 1,000 rad, what was that estimated/calculated dose? That is the information I need to list the potential AO on our record and still call it complete. Thanks for all your help,

This is supplemental information to that already provided to you and confirmed as being entered correctly.

(1) The patient was notified of the occurrence of the medical event. The document from the licensee indicating that the notification was made is not yet in ADAMS. I confirmed the notification with the inspectors.

(2) A medical consultant was hired to examine the medical event and determine if additional actions are needed.

(3) This medical event will meet the AO criteria.

If you do not require any other information, then this record may be closed. Region I along with some Headquarter divisions will continue to examine the issues and the appropriateness of the licensee's actions.
