11:40 Mr. Van Arsdall was not in the office. I spoke to the receptionist who stated that Mr. Van Arsdall was performing work in the laboratory and she would notify him to call me when he had a break.

14:30 I spoke with Mr. Hausknecht who stated that the papers were handed to him by Mr. Van Arsdall earlier in the month. He was confused by them and had laid them aside for which he apologized. I explained to Mr. Hausknecht the reason why he paid annual fees and why he had to either request to terminate the license or renew it. Mr. Hausknecht reviewed the documents before him and saw that the Hewlett Packard and Varian ECD were transferred to the respective manufacturers in 1994 and 1996. I explained the responsibilities of specific and general licensure to him and referred him to the NRC web pages for a copy of 10 CFR 31.5. Mr. Hausknecht decided that the best course of action for his company was to terminate the NRC license and promised to fax it in today.
